Salvado Catholic College places a strong emphasis on the Christian Pastoral Care of individual students, parents, families and staff – with Christ being the foundation of our Pastoral Care System within the College.

Students are reminded to see themselves as valued and respected members of the College community and a sense of caring, concern and responsibility towards others is fostered in all students.

Staff members are always on hand to assist students with solving difficulties and problems they may encounter on a day-to-day basis with the support of parents and carers. The College also has a Student Wellbeing Coordinator to assist students and families in collaboration with staff to engage students in meaningful life long learning, developing resilience and fostering wellbeing.

The Catholic Education Western Australia Psychology Team also supports the College by working directly with staff, students and parents/carers, and provides consultation and expertise on a variety of areas including whole-school approaches to student wellbeing.



All students belong to a House at Salvado Catholic College.

Our Houses, introduced in 2019, are: **Benedict** ■ **Frayne** ■ **MacKillop** ■ and **Vincent** ■. House Patrons were chosen because of their significant contribution to the life of the Church and their qualities as Catholic leaders; qualities that we strive to instil in our students.

In addition to belonging to a House, when students reach Year 7, they will be part of a Pastoral Care group, with a staff member who closely monitors the general welfare and academic progress of each student.



Catholic Schools are Christ-centred, child-focused places of learning and faith formation. We believe children and young people reach their God-given potential through developing and flourishing in a safe environment.

All members of the College community need to work together to provide school environments that are not only safe, but allow and encourage students to learn about healthy and respectful relationships. The dignity of children and their right to be, and feel, safe in our Catholic schools is central to our success as educators and as a system in supporting each child to have life to the full.

The *Child Safe Framework* applies to all Catholic Schools and care centres in Western Australia, and the staff, parents, volunteers and school communities. The *Child Safe Framework* sets out best practice to develop the knowledge, mindsets, practice and behaviours that enable and sustain a child safe culture and wellbeing for all CEWA students.

Keeping Safe: Child Protection Curriculum

Staff at Salvado Catholic College have been trained in the Keeping Safe: Child Protection Curriculum.

Developed by the Government of South Australia, Keeping Safe is highly regarded Australia-wide and is being supported by Catholic Education Western Australia. The Keeping Safe: Child Protection Curriculum is delivered to all students from Pre-Kindergarten to Year 12 in all schools in Catholic Education Western Australia.

The Keeping Safe: Child Protection Curriculum is based on two themes:

1. We all have the right to be safe.
2. We can help ourselves to be safe by talking to people we trust.

The themes are delivered to children through four focus areas that increase in complexity:

1. The right to be safe
2. Relationships
3. Recognising and reporting abuse
4. Protective strategies



Salvado Catholic College has wireless internet and network access throughout, as well as digital television screens in each Learning Space.

There are banks of iPads available for students in Kindergarten to Year 3 to utilise in their learning environment. The Year 4 to Year 6 students are part of a 1:1 iPad program.

The Year 7 students will also have a managed 1:1 device. For both teachers and students, integration and utilisation of the digital technology devices is a focus across the College, to assist in broadening the students' learning experiences and knowledge in the digital world in which we live and learn today.

The 1:1 Device Program is designed to:

- Further enhance the teaching and learning of the mandated Western Australian Technologies Curriculum
- Enhance student engagement
- Provide further opportunities for collaboration and critical thinking
- Prepare students to be successful learners in a digital world
- Equip students with the knowledge and skills needed for success in a rapidly evolving world
- Provide students with further opportunities for deeper research and learning
- Provide students with a creative tool to further enhance their knowledge and understanding.



Curriculum

The School Curriculum and Standards Authority (SCSA) requires all students to be taught 8 different Learning Areas.

As Salvado Catholic College is a Catholic College, in addition to the required SCSA subjects, Religious Education is also taught in all primary and secondary classes. The Curriculum delivered to the students of Salvado Catholic College includes the following:

- Religious Education
- English
- Mathematics
- Humanities and Social Sciences
- Science
- The Arts
- Technologies
- Health and Physical Education
- Languages

In order to ensure that our students in the Primary Campus can be taught these subjects in a comprehensive and creative way, we have already developed some outstanding facilities. Once students enter Secondary schooling, these subjects become more complex and as a result, we will be adding brand new specialist Learning Spaces for our Year 7's in order to deliver teaching and learning in the areas of:

- Science
- Design and Technology – Materials
- Food Technology
- Visual Arts and Fashion
- STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics).



Diverse Learning and Differentiated Teaching

Salvado Catholic College is committed to ensuring that all students receive the support they need to learn and grow. All children have an equal right to an appropriate and inclusive education.

Students with additional needs who are enrolled at Salvado Catholic College receive assistance through a range of methods including, among others:

- Individualised Education Plans
- Access to specialised programs, resources and equipment
- Small group or individual instruction
- Education Assistant support.

Furthermore, at Salvado Catholic College, we look to identify, monitor and foster outstanding potential (giftedness) and outstanding performance (talent) in our College community, from the early childhood, primary and secondary years.

Scholarships and Bursaries

At Salvado Catholic College we want our students to strive to be the best that they can be in all aspects of life.

The College will be providing a limited number of scholarships and bursaries to our incoming Secondary students. These scholarships will include an Academic Scholarship and an Aboriginal Secondary Student Bursary.

Over time, as the number of students attending the College expands, so too will our facilities. In addition to a number of general Learning Area Spaces, as part of the Master Plan, Salvado Catholic College plans on building the following facilities in time:

- Design and Technology Centre
